### WING TIPS

- **SDWG CADET LEADERSHIP ACADEMY – RESCHEDULED.** The SDWG Cadet Leadership Academy has been rescheduled to January 31st - February 2nd. This is a weekend course that is held in Sioux Falls and designed to help cadets advance their leadership and team-building skills. The academy will be a mix of classroom and hands-on activities created and instructed by experienced cadets and senior members. - **U.S. SPACE FORCE ESTABLISHED:** President Donald Trump on 20 December established the U.S. Space Force as America's sixth military service, one of the most significant changes in Air Force history and a milestone in America's exploration and militarization of the cosmos. The Space Force is the Pentagon's first branch of the military solely dedicated to organizing, training, and equipping personnel to operate and protect military space assets. It is within the Air Force (the same as the Marine Corps is within the Navy) and draws on much of the service's existing bureaucracy, while aiming to create its own culture and structure to prioritize and tackle space in new ways



- **AERIAL WILDLIFE SURVEYS:** SDWG flew five aerial surveys of terrestrial wildlife over five days in December in support of the state’s Department of Game, Fish & Parks (GF&P) and South Dakota State University (SDSU). Both organizations have continually ongoing research projects surveying mountain lions, bobcats, swift foxes, white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, bighorn sheep, and mountain goats. The result was 16.7 hours flying over western South Dakota and the Black Hills and 3.2 hours flying over eastern South Dakota for a total of 19.9

flight hours. CAP pilots were: Lt. Col. Gary Hewett, four sorties; and Lt. Col. Duncan Keirnes, one sortie. Depending whom the sortie supported the pilot was accompanied by a representative from SDSU or from GF&P.

The WOFPO will be the Point of Contact for Squadrons/Squadron Orientation Flight Coordinators (SOFC) to send their requests for orientation flights. This will allow the WOFPO to see what the need is and where, as well as establish the priority for squadrons/cadets needing flights as they are available. The WOFPO will then schedule a date and line up pilots for the flights.

- **WEX CARDS**: The Wing Admin is currently working on getting new WEX – Vehicle – Non-AF cards out to the squadrons. One of the real challenges she has is determining who is paying the WEX charges, i.e., squadron or wing.

All Squadron CC are receiving new WEX – Vehicle – Non-AF cards. Please remember:

1. Only use the WEX card on Non-AF missions
2. Replace the expired one in each vehicle binder
3. Let Rachel know who is paying for each use (put it in WMIRS notes)

- **ANIMAL TRACKING SHEETS**: We have new procedures for getting the animal tracking sheets to the wing. Pilots: If you fly an animal tracking mission you need to e-mail the animal tracking sheet to [rkuecker@capnhq.gov](mailto:rkuecker@capnhq.gov) AND [tom.bass@sdwg.cap.gov](mailto:tom.bass@sdwg.cap.gov).

- **SQUADRON DEPOSITS**: When a squadron makes a deposit into their bank account, The Wing Admin needs a copy of both the check and deposit slip and a SDWG-173. If she has to request a copy of the check from Wells Fargo, we will be charged for that copy. Going forward if the wing is charged for the copy, the squadron will be billed for the cost of the copy.
